

# Father's Day Bookmark

## CROCHET PATTERN

Let's make a lovely Father's Day gift for the important man in your life! This bookmark is a simple tapestry design! Working with only two colors throughout leaves you with minimal ends to weave in while still having a stunning result!

### SUPPLIES:

- Size 10 crochet thread, any 2 colors, approx 70 yards of each.
- Size 1.65 mm crochet hook
- Tapestry needle and scissors
- Fabric stiffener, like Aleene's Fabric Stiffening Spray, t-pins, and a blocking mat



## ABBREVIATIONS (US TERMS):

ch = chain

dc = double crochet

sl st = slip stitch

st/sts = stitch/stitches

sp = space

sc = single crochet

( ) = complete these instructions in one stitch

\* = indicates where to begin repeat from

## NOTES:

- For the best look to achieve a flat bookmark, you'll need to stiffen it. I use Aleene's Fabric Stiffening Spray and t-pins on a blocking mat.
- Stitch counts are marked at the end of each row with [ ] except for tapestry section where each row is 63 stitches
- Finished dimensions: 2 in by 6.5 in
- Beginning chains count as stitches for the stitch counts.
- You may carry the thread behind the stitches in order to minimize end weaving. When you reach the last st of each row using color B, tuck color B onto the other side so that you may pick it back up when you reach the first st using color B on the next row.

## GAUGE:

Gauge is not really necessary for this pattern. Personally, I find the smallest hook I can handle for the thread size produces the best, tightly stitched look. If you desire to gauge swatch: 12 sts in 13 rows of single crochet = 1 inch

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## WRITTEN INSTRUCTIONS:

### Tapestry portion **Daddy**

For the tapestry crochet section, there are two set up rows:

Row 1: With color A, ch 64, sc 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook and each ch across, ch 1, turn. [63 sc]

Row 2: Sc each st across, ch 1, turn. [63 sc]

After the set up rows, you'll be continuing in sc each st, with a ch-1 and turn at the end of each row. A represents color A and B is for color B. A 4 means crochet 1 sc in each of the next four stitches with color A. You can also use the provided chart for this part.

Row 3: A 63

Row 4: A 51, B 5, A 7

Row 5: A 6, B 7, A 50

Row 6: A 49, B 3, A 3, B 2, A 6

Row 7: A 6, B 2, A 4, B 2, A 49

Row 8: A 55, B 2, A 6

Row 9: A 6, B 2, A 55

Row 10: A 5, B 5, A 10, B 3, A 1, B 2, A 4, B 3, A 2, B 2, A 4, B 3, A 2, B 2, A 4, B 5, A 6

Row 11: A 6, B 6, A 3, B 8, A 3, B 8, A 3, B 7, A 6, B 8, A 5

Row 12: A 5, B 2, A 3, B 4, A 4, B 2, A 3, B 2, A 3, B 2, A 3, B 3, A 3, B 2, A 3, B 3, A 3, B 3, A 1, B 3, A 6

Row 13: A 6, B 2, A 3, B 2, A 3, B 2, A 4, B 2, A 3, B 2, A 4, B 2, A 3, B 2, A 3, B 2, A 3, B 3, A 5, B 2, A 5

Row 14: A 5, B 2, A 6, B 2, A 3, B 2, A 3, B 2, A 3, B 2, A 4, B 2, A 3, B 2, A 4, B 2, A 3, B 2, A 3, B 2, A 6

Row 15: A 6, B 2, A 3, B 2, A 3, B 3, A 3, B 2, A 3, B 3, A 3, B 2, A 3, B 2, A 3, B 2, A 3, B 2, A 6, B 2, A 5

Row 16: A 5, B 2, A 6, B 2, A 4, B 5, A 5, B 7, A 4, B 7, A 3, B 2, A 3, B 3, A 5

Row 17: A 5, B 2, A 9, B 2, A 1, B 3, A 5, B 2, A 1, B 3, A 7, B 3, A 5, B 2, A 6, B 2, A 5

Row 18: A 5, B 2, A 6, B 2, A 19, B 2, A 9, B 2, A 16

Row 19: A 16, B 2, A 9, B 2, A 20, B 2, A 5, B 2, A 5

Row 20: A 5, B 2, A 5, B 2, A 20, B 2, A 9, B 2, A 16

Row 21: A 15, B 3, A 8, B 3, A 20, B 10, A 4

Row 22: A 4, B 8, A 23, B 2, A 9, B 2, A 15

Row 23: A 63

Row 24: A 63

Row 25: A 63

Next, crochet the lace on the ends of the bookmark:

Row 1: With color A, sc in the end of each row, turn. Change to color B. [25 sc]

Row 2: Ch 2, sk 2 sts {(dc, ch 1, dc) next st, sk 2 sts}, repeat { } twice, then (dc, ch 1, dc) next st, sk st, repeat { } three times, (dc, ch 1, dc), sk st, dc last st, turn. [18 dc]

Row 3: Ch 2, (dc, ch 1, dc) in each ch -1 sp until last, dc, last st, turn. [18 dc]

Row 4: Repeat row 3, fasten off, weave in ends. [18 dc]

Repeat on other end of bookmark.

## BLOCKING AND ASSEMBLY:

Pin to the blocking mat to desired shape. Spray from about 6-10 inches away with fabric stiffening spray, or pour some of the spray liquid into a small cup and paint the liquid on.
